Always a pleasure to visit possibly one of the most picturesque settings for a bowls green. It is certainly a credit to the club to have recovered from a disastrous winter that saw the clubhouse under two foot of water and the sand, under the all-weather surface, disturbed up into lumps and piles.

Roger Hopkins' triple on Rink2 were in front 5-4 at the 6th end then again 6-5 at the 8th end but then dropped nine-shots on the next five ends to find themselves 6-14 down at the 12th end. Five-shots brought them back to 11-14 at the 16th end but two single shots against on the final two ends gave a final score of 11-16. Jack Lafford fared much better on Rink3 and steamrolled to an 18-1 lead at the 7th end, even five-shots away on the 8th end did not dent the score too much as they went on to score seven-shots to four-shots over the remaining ends to finish convincing 25-10 winners and collected the pens. John Hurren on Rink4 also enjoyed the green and were always in front bar a couple of ends around the 8th end but then pulled back in front on the 12th end when 11-10 up. Twelve-shots to six on the final six ends resulted in a 23-16 win. Similarly Jeff Bizzell on Rink5 went from 6-1 up at the 5th end to 14-4 at the 12th end, then 18-7 at the 14th end and ended 20-11 winners.

Some Malmesbury bowlers commented on how well we adjusted to the all-weather surface, proof that bowling technique helps a great deal.
