Charlbury were our visitors in this Mixed League game and provided very tough opposition.

Rink1 saw Jack Lafford's triple go from 11-4 up at the 10<sup>th</sup> end to then conceded 9-shots without reply and found themselves 11-13 down at the 15<sup>th</sup> end. Three shots on the next two ends put them back in front 14-13 going into the last end where they dropped four-shots and finished 14-17 down. Steve Gould on Rink2 were only threatened when their opposition came back to 7-6 at the 8<sup>th</sup> end and never looked to get close again with the home triple going on to be 16-8 in front at the 14<sup>th</sup> end then finishing 19-11 victors. From being 5-2 up at the 5<sup>th</sup> end John Hurren then did not score again until the 11<sup>th</sup> end when 2-shots put them at 7-11 and, although they scored a 4 at the 13<sup>th</sup> end this was cancelled by 2 and two singles for a score of 11-15 at the 15<sup>th</sup> end with a final result of 14-17. A nip and tuck game on Rink4 had Tim Stacey equal pegging at 8-8 on the 11<sup>th</sup> end which went to 8-10 at the 13<sup>th</sup> end. Four shots at both the 14<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> ends with two against put the scores at 16-12 going into the final end where a single shot enabled a 17-12 win.

Given that the final aggregate difference was only seven shots all rinks made a contribution to making the final overall score 8 points to 4.
